4.0 POLICY

4.1 Only the Office of General Counsel or the Attorney General's Office may provide legal counsel to the University. University employees seeking legal counsel for University matters should contact the Office of General Counsel, after obtaining approval from the appropriate dean, administrative head, vice president, the President, or appropriate member of the President's staff. Such approval can be provided on a standing or case-by-case basis. If University employees believe that the appropriate dean, administrative head, vice president, administrative head, vice president dean, administrative head, vice president, etc., has engaged in conduct that places the University at legal risk, they may contact the General Counsel to inform the General Counsel of such a concern without obtaining the above-described approval.

4.2 The Office of General Counsel will comply with Regent Policy R135. As the coordinator of legal affairs for the University, the General Counsel will assign legal matters to and consult with the Attorney General's Office in accordance with Regents Policy R135 and as needed to provide legal services to the University.

4.3 University trustees, officers, and employees should not contact or engage outside counsel to provide legal services to the University but should instead contact the General Counsel, who will engage outside counsel if needed.

Issues/Concerns (including fiscal, legal, and compliance impact):

These policies were originally put into effect in 1998 and 2006, respectively, and have since become no longer applicable to the university.

Policy 108 *Contacting the Trustees or Regents* contains one sentence and is unnecessary. Authorization to speak on behalf of the university is typically addressed in job descriptions or by specific delegation from an executive whose job includes speaking for the university. If necessary, this topic could be addressed more fully in Policy 161 *Freedom of Speech*.

Policy 109 Contacting the Office of General Counsel and the Attorney General's Office, contains basic guidelines on working with lawyers, which should exist (and does exist) on the OGC website rather than in official policy.

Suggested Changes: Because these policies are no longer relevant, these policies should be deleted from the Policy Manual.
